Request for Quotations: Mobile Medical Services for Street Medicine Program

Central Pines Regional Council is issuing a Request for Quotes (RFQ) and solicitating responses from licensed medical providers (MD, DO, NP, or PA) to deliver mobile clinical services as part of a Street Medicine Pilot Program – serving individuals who are unhoused or at risk of being unhoused in Durham, North Carolina. Services will be delivered in mobile and non-traditional settings that meet community members where they are in the community. This includes but is not limited to encampments, sidewalks, and mobile units, while working alongside a multidisciplinary outreach team.

1. Scope of Services

- a. Deliver direct medical care in rural and urban community settings across Durham County (encampments, shelters, public spaces)
- b. Provide treatment for acute and chronic health issues, wound care, and vaccinations
 - i. Provide other relevant specialist services/treatments
- c. Collaborate with behavioral health, case management, and harm reduction staff
- d. Refer and coordinate care with local clinics, hospitals, and social services
- e. Participate in regular mobile outreach efforts and team meetings
- f. Document care in a secure, HIPAA-compliant system

2. Minimum Qualifications

- a. Active MD, DO, NP, or PA license in North Carolina
- b. Ability and willingness to work in a mobile capacity in Durham County
- c. Familiarity with trauma-informed and harm-reduction care
- d. Malpractice or liability insurance

3. Submission Requirements

- Rate: Provide a proposed hourly or shift-based rate for each individual on your team.
 Provide a rate for any other additional expenses that are needed to conduct the proposed work.
- 2. **Availability:** Provide weekly or monthly availability for mobile outreach for each member of your team.
- 3. **Resume/CV:** Highlight relevant experience, credentials/licenses, and community-based care involvement.
- 4. **Proof of Licensure:** Demonstration of active NC medical license(s) is required.
- 5. Written Responses (max 500 words each):
 - a. What types of medical services can you and your team provide in a street outreach setting?
 - b. How do you ensure safety and privacy during mobile-based care?
 - c. What is your experience working with unhoused or vulnerable populations?
 - d. How do you coordinate referrals and continuity of care with other providers or systems?
 - e. Do you have experience working within Durham County and do you already have partnerships with related medical and/or housing/social service providers in the community?
