STATISTICS

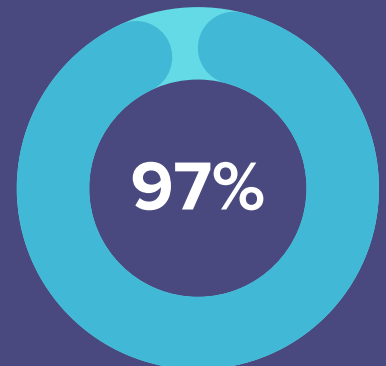
- **97%** of residents have access to broadband.
- **78%** of residents have a subscription.
- Over **9,000** households do not have a broadband subscription.
- **~4,000** residents do not have an internet-enabled device.
- **~9,600** residents only have a smartphone to access the internet.
- **10%** of residents live below the poverty line; **17%** are low income.
- **40%** of non-English-primary residents aged 5+ have limited English proficiency.
- **21%** of residents are ages 60+.

CHALLENGES

Although broadband access is widespread in Moore County, concerns remain regarding affordability and accessibility, as outlined below:

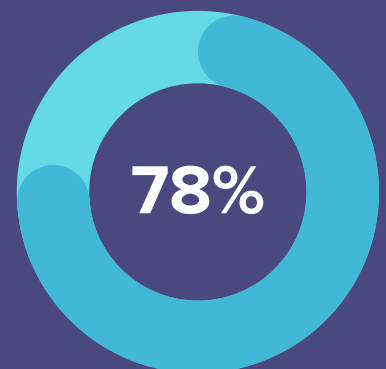
- Some areas of Moore County, particularly in the northwest, southwest, and southeast portions, remain entirely **unserved** by broadband.
- Homelessness remains an ongoing concern, with Moore County experiencing an estimated **32% increase** in unsheltered individuals between 2024 and 2025.
- While 97% of the county has access to Broadband, only 78% have adopted broadband, indicating affordability or accessibility barriers.
